

ORDINANCE NO. 1152

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY, KANSAS AND ALL OTHER LAND OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS OF CAWKER CITY OWNED AND/OR CONTROLLED, NOW AND IN THE FUTURE, BY THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES 2018 EDITION," WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS; AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1148.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1: INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Cawker City, Kansas and all other land outside the city limits of Cawker City owned and/or controlled, now and in the future, by the City of Cawker City, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code, 2018 Edition," prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1152," with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this Ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Uniform Public Offense Code similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2: REPEAL. Ordinance number 1148 is repealed.

Section 3: EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. 1153

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES, 2018 EDITION", AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1147.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1: INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Cawker City, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," 2018 Edition, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed. No fewer than three copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1153," with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this Ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2: TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.

(a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. Supp. 8-2118.

(b) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.

Section 3: PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED FINES. The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the municipal judge establishes a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$10.00 nor more than \$2,500.00, except for speeding which shall not be less than \$30.00 nor more than \$1,000.00. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has not been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the court not to exceed \$2,500.00.

Section 4: REPEAL. Ordinance number 1147 is hereby repealed.

Section 5: EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and one publication in the official city newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. 1155

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15, ARTICLE 4, SEWERS, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CAWKER CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1: Chapter 15, Article 4, Section 440, subsection (b)(1) of the Code of the City of Cawker City, Kansas, hereby is amended to read as follows:

15-440(b)(1) Single Family Residence -- \$17.

Section 2: Chapter 15, Article 4, Section 440, subsection (b)(9) of the Code of the City of Cawker City, Kansas, hereby is amended to read as follows:

15-440(b)(9) Designated RV Park -- \$19.

Section 3: Chapter 15, Article 4, Section 440, subsection (b)(12) of the Code of the City of Cawker City, Kansas, hereby is amended to read as follows:

15-440(b)(12) Business establishment not otherwise classified or enumerated herein -- \$19.

Section 4: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and one publication in the official city newspaper and at the time of the September, 2018 utility billing.
